


- **Servicemember Universally Defined in State Code** – Includes guard and reserve members
- **Veteran Universally Defined in State Code** – After serving 180 cumulative days
- **Spouse Licensure and Reciprocity** – Automatic transferability
- **401K Portability for PCS/Relocation** – Retain employer contributions in Utah Retirement Systems
- **Military Interstate Children's Compact** – Only state to offer FULL protections to the guard and reserve
- **Employment Preference in State/Local Government and Private Sector Hiring** – Expanded to include servicemembers, veterans, and their spouses
- **PCS/Relocation Benefits for DOD Civilians** – Same benefits as military families
- **Paid Military Leave** – Governor increased from 15 to 20 days for executive agencies
- **Education Military Support Teams** – Funded therapists and advocates in four school districts
- **Military Family Life Consultants** – UTNG funds six LCSW's providing service statewide
- **In-State Tuition for Higher Education** – For all service members, veterans, and their dependents
- **High School athletics/activities protections** – Streamlined documentation for PCS/relocation and full eligibility
- **Mission Ready Resource Fairs** - Connecting families with partners and federal, State, non-profit services
- **Family Resiliency Programs** - Spanning and collaborating across our veteran, military and k-12 community.

INSTALLATION RESILIENCY

- **Great Salt Lake Sentinel Landscape** (Federal) – Awarded June 2024
 - 2.77 Million Acres across nine counties
 - Encompasses Hill Air Force Base, Camp Williams, Tooele Army Depot, and Little Mountain Test Facility
 - Consortium of 40+ Federal, State, Local, & Private partners
 - Integrated with Great Salt Lake strategic plan
- **West Traverse Sentinel Landscape** (State) – Over \$20+M in state funds leveraging \$90M in projects
- **Land use changes near installations & wind turbines** – UDVMA approval required
- **Restricted foreign entities** – Banned from owning property
- **Intergovernmental Service Agreements** - State/local authorities to enter into IGSA's with DoD
- **Food delivery dead zones** – Prevents online food orders to or from installations
- **Military Installation Development Authority (MIDA)**
 - Hill AFB Project Area (1.3M SF office space, three gates, new interchange, software building, museum, and hotel)
 - Grand Hyatt Deer Valley MWR Hotel
 - Army Reserve facilities at Camp Williams
 - National Security Administration (NSA) facility
 - Utah National Guard properties recently designated project area
