## **GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE**


**Utah Governor Gary R. Herbert**

# Hill Air Force Base



**H**ILL AIR FORCE BASE, Utah — For years, the Hill Aerospace Museum has been a “must-see” attraction in northern Utah. More than 265,000 visitors a year tour the museum’s airpark and indoor galleries spanning 30-acres.

Now, one of the largest travel sites on the web is saying the same.

The website Trip Advisor, a site dedicated to travel-related content and visitor reviews, recognized the Hill Aerospace Museum last month with its Hall of Fame award for receiving the site’s Certificate of Excellence five years in a row.

The site issues the certificates to establishments based on continued excellence in hospitality and people who provided reviews on Trip Advisor ranked the Hill Aerospace Museum as the number one place to visit in the region.

Aaron Clark, the museum’s director, said he’s elated to receive the recognition and credited the museum’s professional staff for staying focused on customer service, its collection and exhibits, care of the museum grounds and facility, and encouraging community involvement.

“We have and will continue to listen to our customers,” Clark said.

Since becoming the museum director in 2013, the museum has shifted to developing engaging exhibits that show the rich history of Hill Air Force Base and Utah aviation.

Clark said the museum’s grounds, facility and collection are cared for by dedicated staff and volunteers. In addition, the Aerospace Heritage Foundation of Utah is a private, non-profit organization that provides capital support for the museum.

“We have federal employees, volunteers, and a foundation all working together. This award is a direct testament to their selfless efforts,” Clark said. “Museums are about community, and we have and will continue to involve numerous community members in our operations.”

Recognition aside, Clark said the museum isn’t finished with making improvements.

The museum is nearing completion of an interactive “C-130 experience” classroom where visitors will be able to climb into the cockpit and learn more about the long and diverse history of the aircraft. The exhibit will also be used as a classroom where the museum will offer programs focused on STEM (science, technology, engineering and math.)

Other recent additions to the museum include a new Utah Aviation Hall of Fame, a display dedicated to Hill’s namesake Maj. Ployer B. Hill, an F-16 Thunderbird static display, and an aerospace education center with four classrooms.

Clark said the Aerospace Heritage Foundation of Utah is continually fundraising for new exhibits and programs. Plans are underway for construction of a third gallery that will house all the aircraft currently on display outside the museum.

The museum is open from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday-Saturday. Admission is free. Visit:

## Utah Golf Foundation's Veterans on Course Schedule Set for 2018

MILLCREEK, UTAH – Following back-to-back seasons of overwhelming growth, the Utah Golf Foundation looks forward to another successful year of Veterans on Course (VOC) events. With 11 VOC events scheduled throughout the state of Utah, the UGF expects the 2018 season to be nothing short of incredible.

Veterans on Course, a program open to male and female Military personnel of active or Veteran status, was started in 2016 by the Utah Golf Foundation as a pilot program to provide instruction and playing opportunities to Military personnel of all ages and skill levels free of charge. Each event consists of lessons from PGA Professionals, a nine-hole scramble tournament and a social gathering with hors d'oeuvres and a guest speaker.

The 2016 inaugural VOC season included four events, all of which filled to maximum capacity. Due to the program's awe-inspiring success, the 2017 schedule was comprised of nine events throughout Utah. More than 600 Military Veterans participated. In 2018, 11 events will be hosted from Logan to St. George, with an expectation of nearly 800 participants.

### **Vet Finds Support to Land Dream Job through Workforce Services**

In February 2018, David J. Davis visited the Department of Workforce Services Employment Center in Lehi, Utah, to receive help finding a job. David had served in the U.S. Army from March 1996 until March 2016, when he was honorably discharged with his E-7 Sergeant First Class rank.

He was initially trained as a Heavy Wheel Mechanic, where he served his first five years. He was subsequently trained at the Defense Language Institute (DLI) as a French Linguist to work in Army Intelligence, where he spent the rest of his service. David served multiple tours including in Kosovo and Iraq. The tours in Iraq were part of Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom.

Hal Hooper, a Veteran Employment Representative at the employment center, checked David's eligibility for job search help with the Disabled Veterans Outreach Program (DVOP). After completing the initial eligibility check, Hal met with David to scan his verification documents and complete the assessment.

Hal helped David develop an employment plan, and provide labor market information training, job search strategies, resume enhancement, job

and informational interviewing and networking methodologies. David needed additional help with resume building, networking and developing his interviewing skills, so Hal referred David to Mike Hanley, a Work Success Coach at the Lehi Employment Center. Hal helped David identify places to improve his job seeker registration and resume. David made the recommended changes to increase his likelihood of getting a job.

He was soon asked to interview in a short amount of time and was successfully hired by Teleperformance in Sandy, Utah. David currently works as a customer service representative, and makes \$16 per hour plus commissions, with an opportunity for income growth and job advancement. David enjoys his job and using his computer and communication skills and says it is going very well. 🇺🇸

## Salt Lake City's Outreach Team Making a Difference

On April 11 and 12, 2018, the Salt Lake City Regional Office Outreach Team attended both the Navajo Nation Aneth and Red Mesa Chapters' monthly meeting. These events were held at the respective Aneth and Red Mesa Chapter areas. The Outreach Team worked in conjunction with the Utah Department of Veterans and Military Affairs to provide information about services offered by the Veterans Benefits Administration.

This teamwork approach and advocacy is having a positive impact towards meeting the needs of Navajo Aneth and Red Mesa Chapter Veterans and Veteran Families.

On April 11, 2018, the Aneth Chapter meeting was attended by 31 Veterans and family members. This community event brought in not only Veterans, but Veterans' family members. The SLC Outreach team spoke with Veterans, received a new claim, and provided status of claims. For one Veteran, the team

requested RO Appeals assistance and within 24 hours of the event, the Veteran was contacted and received his requested information.

On April 12, 2018, the Red Mesa Chapter meeting was attended by 35 Veterans and family members. The SLC Outreach team spoke with approximately 13 individuals. The Team received 4 new disability claims, 2 Intent to File applications and provided a number of status of claims and appeals.

These events helped build bridges and showcase the "I CARE" Values of the Salt Lake City Regional Office in serving our Nation's Native American Navajo Veterans and their families. 🇺🇸

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## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### HOW DO I GET A COPY OF MY DD214 RELEASE FROM ACTIVE DUTY SERVICE DOCUMENT)?

If your home of record upon your release from active duty service was within the State of Utah, then the Utah Department of Veterans and Military Affairs may have a copy in our archive. You can send a request to 550 Foothill Drive, Suite 105 Salt Lake City, Utah 84113; call 800-894-9497 or 801-326-2372; or you can email veterans@utah.gov. To search the archive we will need your:

- Full Name
- Date of Birth
- Last four digits of your Social Security Number

There is no cost for certified copies of your DD214. You will need to be present and present valid photo identification at 550 Foothill Drive, Suite 105, Salt Lake City, Utah 84113 to receive your certified copies.

### WHAT IS THE DISABLED VETERANS PROPERTY TAX ABATEMENT?

A Utah permanent place-of-residence property tax abatement using the military service-connected disability rating percentage is available for disabled Veterans, their un-remarried widows, or minor orphans. The Veteran's disability rating must be at least 10% in order to qualify for this abatement.

Here is the formula used to determine eligibility: The maximum property tax abatement rated at 100% military service-connected disability is \$260,370. Multiply your percentage of disability by 260,370. Example: a 10% disability X 260,370 = \$26,037.00 tax abatement. This amount is then subtracted from the taxable value of the property and taxes are paid on the remaining amount.

### WHAT IS THE STATUS OF MY VETERANS ADMINISTRATION CLAIM?

There are several ways to check the status for VA disability claims. You can check online using an eBenefits account, or you can go to a VA regional office and have a VA employee assist you. The Salt Lake Regional Office located at 550 Foothill Drive Salt Lake City Utah. You can also call the VA toll free at 1-800-827-1000. 🇺🇸
